



The British Air Transport Association (BATA) represents UK-registered airlines. Our members are British Airways, DHL, easyJet, Flybe, Jet2.com, Monarch, RVL Group, Thomas Cook, Thomson Airways, Titan Airways and Virgin Atlantic. In 2013, BATA airlines carried 133 million passengers and 1.1 million tonnes of cargo and employed 74,000 people.
